

NAIO™ Practitioner Pathway Overview

The NAIO™ Practitioner Certification Training is a 900-hour formation pathway integrating somatic awareness, ecological philosophy, and relational embodiment. It cultivates presence, depth, and ethical maturity—preparing practitioners to facilitate awareness-based learning, movement education, and somatic inquiry grounded in trauma-informed, ecological, and cosmological understanding.

Duration: 18 months – 4 years

Format: Hybrid (in-person immersives + live online learning + asynchronous

study + salons + independent practice)

Program Composition & Hour Breakdown

Residential Immersives	240	Three 72-hour immersives + Introductory Workshop (24 hours). Trauma-informed, experiential, and somatically grounded.

Salons – Reflective Integration Gatherings	30	Twelve facilitated salons (six × 2 hrs in-person + six × 3 hrs online). Group reflection, supervision, and ethical dialogue.
Independent Client Practice	150	Documented practice sessions (minimum 1 hour each) with peers or clients; reflective learning and practitioner skill development.

Detailed Structure of the 900 Hours

<u>Residential Immersives – 240 Hours</u>

<u>Immersive</u>	<u>Focus</u>	<u>Hours</u>
Introductory Workshop – Foundations & Trauma-Informed Principles	Orientation to the NAIO [™] process. Foundational somatic and perceptual skills, trauma-informed awareness, consent, and ethical grounding for relational practice.	24
Immersive I – Basis–Primordia: Embodied Awareness	Entering the primordial ground of perception and being. Grounding, sensory ecology, relational field, touch, and presence. Cultivating direct somatic literacy and attunement with the natural matrix.	72
Immersive II – Bios–Physis: Relational Practice	Working within the living field of relationship. Dialogue, movement integration, and embodied communication. Exploring organismic intelligence, life systems, and intersubjective flow.	72
Immersive III – Matrix–Cosmos: Practitioner Integration	Integration of the full training arc. Ethical application, scope of practice, and practitioner embodiment. Readiness evaluation and the practitioner's relation to larger ecological and cosmic contexts.	72

Format:

Residential retreat environments with experiential group learning, guided dyadic practice, and faculty mentoring. Each immersive builds upon the previous—moving from foundational trauma-informed awareness (Basis-Primordia), through relational dynamics (Bios-Physis), to cosmological and practitioner integration (Matrix-Cosmos).

<u>Guided Online Learning & Mentorship - 270 Hours</u>

<u>Mode</u>	<u>Hours</u>	<u>Description</u>
Synchronous (Live Online Sessions)	150	Real-time interactive learning: live classes, mentoring circles, and peer supervision.
Asynchronous (Self-Paced Study)	120	Recorded lectures, readings, assignments, and reflective journaling.

<u>Salons - Reflective Integration Gatherings - 30 Hours</u>

Purpose:

Facilitated group dialogues and reflective circles supporting integration, ethical inquiry, and practitioner embodiment. Salons provide a structured container for synthesis and community reflection between immersives.

In-Person Salons	6	2 hrs	12	Integration gatherings held during or around immersives.
Online Group Salons	6	3 hrs	18	Extended reflective dialogues on ethics, group dynamics, and practice review.
<u>Total</u>			<u>30</u> <u>Hours</u>	Required participation; flexible scheduling supports cohort rhythm.

Independent Client Practice - 150 Hours

Students complete 150 hours of documented client practice sessions, conducted with peers, volunteers, or community participants.

Guidelines:

- Each session must be a minimum of 1 hour
- Informed consent required (forms provided)
- Maintain confidentiality; omit identifying content
- Record date, duration, and session focus

Purpose:

To develop practitioner competence, relational skill, and the applied embodiment of NAIO™ principles. Logs are reviewed for verification and ethical compliance.

Personal NAIO™ Sessions	20 (≈10 sessions)	Receiving sessions from certified practitioners or approved faculty to deepen experiential embodiment.		
Somatic Practice	30	Documented awareness or movement practice integrating NAIO™ principles.		
Capstone Project	10	Final synthesis demonstrating applied understanding, ethical development, and practitioner readiness.

Certification Requirements

To qualify as a **Certified NAIO™ Practitioner**, students must:

- Complete all 900 hours of required training.
- Fulfill 30 hours of therapy with a licensed professional during training.
- Maintain 2 years sobriety (if applicable); abstain from psychoactive or plant-medicine use during training.
- Submit verified Practice Logs, Home Study, and Session Logs.
- Complete the Capstone Project (10 hrs).
- Attend all required salons and immersives.
- Demonstrate ethical maturity, embodied presence, practitioner competence, mind-body integration and competent articulation of NAIO™ Principles..

Re-Certification Requirements

Certified NAIO™ Practitioners must complete re-certification every two (2) years prior to their renewal date.

Required Components

- 1. Twenty (20) hours of continuing education, which may include therapy, somatic education, or approved movement practices.
- 2. Attendance at one NAIO™ Advanced Workshop.
- 3. Attendance at one NAIO™ Practitioner Gathering.
- **4**. Ten (10) hours of NAIO[™] sessions or personal salon participation directly with the Licensor, Founder or an approved Educator.

Submission

Proof of completion must be submitted to NAIO™ International no later than seven (7) days before the renewal date.

Accepted proof includes certificates, signed verification letters, receipts, or verified session logs.

Scope & Practitioner Responsibility

NAIO™ Practitioners are educators and facilitators, not licensed medical or psychological professionals (unless separately credentialed).

Graduates must:

- Work within educational and ethical scope.
- Maintain professional insurance.
- Adhere to NAIO[™] Ethical and Trademark Use Agreements.
